

'GO' Team: Ethiopia 2018

18th - 26th November 2018

Thank you for your interest in the trip to Ethiopia, to help teach and train church planters.

Please read the following carefully so that you are informed about the context of the trip.

Purpose

To support and encourage our partners, Teklu & Selam Wolde, and to teach the students at the Bible College.

Our Hosts

Teklu and Selam Wolde, Teklu considers himself a member of Wellspring Church—his 'home church'—and we are privileged to be partnering with him as he heads up a ministry called 'Ten Forty Ministries'



Teklu and Selam, work tirelessly to equip missionaries working in the horn of Africa, at great risk to themselves. They have seen thousands upon thousands of Muslims come to Christ in the last 10 years and Teklu's main aim is to train, release and equip leaders to share the good news about Jesus Christ with boldness, clarity, and faithfulness to the Scriptures.

Cost

The cost of the trip is £750 which includes airline tickets and all in-country costs. You would also need to pay for any immunizations you need as well as travel insurance. A deposit of £150 is due on 30 July 2018. Regular payments are appreciated and the full amount must be paid by 31 October 2018. Accommodation

We will be staying in Teklu and Selam's home, which is a 5 minute drive from the Training Centre.



Food

If eating in a hotel the food will be westernised. You will eat Injera, at some point during your stay in Ethiopia, this is usually in the form of wat, a thick stew, served on top of injera, a large sourdough flatbread, which is about 50 centimetres (20 inches) in diameter and made out of fermented teff flour.

When you drink water it should only be from a bottle. Don't drink the tap water. Drink plenty of fluids to keep hydrated; it is quite hot in Ethiopia, but not unbearable.

Visa

You will need a visa to enter Ethiopia. Visas on arrival are available for tourists at Addis Ababa (Bole) International airport, at a cost of approximately \$US50 for 1 month (this cost is included in the trip cost). Your passport should be valid for a minimum period of 6 months from the date of entry into Ethiopia. Make sure you have two blank pages in your passport on arrival.

Insurance and injections

It is <u>essential</u> that you get travel insurance before you go as well as your injections/medications. (Have found Salt Insurance - <u>http://www.saltinsurance.com</u> - has offered travel insurance to places other insurance companies are reluctant to).

Injections:

You need to check with your GP/Practice Nurse at least 6 weeks ahead of travel what injections you may need for travelling to Ethiopia. These are likely to include:

- Hepatitis A
- Typhoid
- Tetanus
- Diphtheria
- Polio

You may or may not have to pay for these injections, that will depend on your doctor!

You should also ensure you have an adequate supply of any medication you yourself need, as you may not be able to get more in Ethiopia if you run out.

Some useful things to take with you:

- Insect repellent cream/lotion, wipes and plug-in devices (those containing DEET are best)
- High factor suncream/lotion, preferably containing insect repellent
- Antihistamine tablets and gel/cream
- Tablets to stop sickness/diarrhoea



- Rehydration tablets (can be useful if you've had the above)
- Laxative tablets
- Loo roll (not all the toilets you will use are sophisticated!!!)
- Antibacterial hand wipes/gel (ditto!)
- Basic First Aid kit
- Hat and sunglasses
- Torch

Clothes

Because of the heat cotton is advisable and polyester should be avoided. It is important to be smartly dressed particularly at church meetings (no shorts). You will be travelling in the rainy season; May is the hottest month of the year, with an average temperature of 25°C, it can get humid in Addis and may rain heavily some days, so tracks and roads may become muddy.



A little background information

Ethiopia is a country in the Horn of Africa and the second-most populous nation on the African continent, after Nigeria. It's bordered by Eritrea to the north, Dijbouti to the northeast, Somalia to the east, Kenya to the south and Sudan and South Sudan to the west.

Ethiopia is the oldest independent country in Africa and the second-oldest official Christian nation in the world after Armenia. Ethiopia is also the place for the first Hijra (615 AD) in Islamic history where the Christian king of Ethiopia accepted Muslim refugees from Mecca sent by the prophet Mohamed.

Ethiopia is one of the oldest countries in the world. In the long and disturbed history of the African continent, Ethiopia remains the only country which has never been colonised. Ethiopia was a



founding member of the UN and is home to the African Union's headquarters. The Old Testament of the Bible records the Queen of Sheba's visit to Jerusalem.



In fact, historians believe that Ethiopia may well be the beginning of mankind. The fossils of the oldest onceliving humans or "Lucy" were discovered in the northern section of Ethiopia. The remains of the fossil are said to be 3.5 million years old.

After a long and difficult period under self-declared "communist" rulers, the country is now back on its feet. The long history assures that there are many historic sites in the country. The natural beauty, with high mountains, lakes, waterfalls as well as arid deserts are among the natural attractions of Ethiopia.
